INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PAPER-SETTER

The question paper will consist of three units I, II and III. Unit I and II will have two four questions each from the respective units of the syllabus and will carry 12 marks each. Unit III is compulsory will consists of two parts. Part- I will contain 8 short answer type questions of 16 marks from the entire syllabus. The candidates are required to attempt all the 8 short answer type questions. Answer to each of these will be of 25-30 words and will carry 2 mark each. Second part of the Unit-III contains a question of map with internal choice. The maps are specified in Unit-III. The map question will carry 11 marks, out of which 7 marks are for filling the map and 4 marks for explanatory note. Therefore the total marks for Unit III will be 27.

Each paper is of 75 marks and of three hours duration. The internal assessment carries 25 marks.
